Program Fee Bills

IFSA-Butler will send a single bill for the entire program fee, which includes tuition, services and housing. Students who opt for independent housing will not be charged the housing component of the program fee.

Tuition

Our tuition fees are based on the arts and social science tuition charged by the host university. However, some universities charge a higher tuition for disciplines such as science, engineering and other specialty areas involving laboratory, studio or field work. We pass the difference between the arts and social science tuition and the charges for special subjects along to the student as a tuition differential. Tuition differential fees are based on previous years' costs and are subject to change.

Housing

The housing component of our program fee is based on the average cost of local student self-catering accommodation, usually a shared room in a regular dormitory, apartment or house without any extra features.

When a student is assigned to full-service housing, such as a residential college, there is a housing supplemental charge incorporating the following additional costs: higher accommodation fee typically charged for full service facilities; various miscellaneous charges such as housing application or registration fees, telephone or computer links; student activity fees; and mandatory board programs. Fees are estimates based on previous years' costs and are subject to change. Please see program materials or contact your IFSA-Butler program advisor for procedures for independent housing options.

† Housing Deposit

All students are required to pay a housing deposit of \$300. This payment is in addition to the program fee but is due on the same date. The deposit is held separately from the program fee and should be paid separately. The deposit is refunded to the student after the program, less any damages, fines or outstanding debts in the student's name.

Supplemental Charges Notes

Charges listed below are approximate costs and may be subject to change. Any fees over these approximate costs will be billed to the responsible party as we receive them from the host university.

1. University of Adelaide

Program participants housed in one of the residential colleges will receive a separate bill of approximately \$2,000 per semester for the additional cost of the housing services and meals.

2. Australian National University

Program participants housed in one of the residential colleges will receive a separate bill of approximately \$1,500–\$3,000 per semester for the additional cost of the housing services and meals.

3. Flinders University

Program participants housed in University Hall will receive a separate bill of approximately \$1,500 per semester for the additional cost of the housing services and meals.

4. Griffith University

Students studying at the conservatory are charged the College of Art tuition.

Program participants housed in one of the residential colleges will receive a separate bill of approximately \$1,500 per semester for the additional cost of the housing services and meals. Students studying at the College of Art or conservatory are usually placed in Nathan Campus housing. If this is not possible, students will be placed closer to the College of Art but receive a supplemental bill for additional housing costs.

5. James Cook University

Program participants housed in one of the residential colleges will receive a separate bill of approximately \$2,000 per semester for the additional cost of the housing services and meals. James Cook charges an additional \$1,500 per semester to students enrolled in more than 12 JCU credits.

6. Macquarie University

Program participants housed in one of the residential colleges will receive a separate bill of approximately \$2,500 per semester for the additional cost of the housing services and meals.

7. University of Melbourne

Program participants housed in one of the residential colleges will receive a separate bill of approximately \$3,500–\$4,500 per semester for the additional cost of the housing services and meals. Students enrolling in Victoria College of the Arts will be required to provide their own materials, which may cost AU\$1,000–\$4,000 per year.

8. Murdoch University

Students who choose to go on the optional Northwest trip should plan to bring an additional approximate \$570 (AU\$740) to cover the cost of this trip.

9. University of New South Wales

Program participants housed in one of the residential colleges will receive a separate bill of approximately \$1,500 per semester for the additional cost of the housing services and meals. New South Wales charges higher tuition for lab courses. Students enrolled in these courses will be billed approximately an additional \$1,000 per semester.

10. University of Queensland

University of Queensland charges higher tuition for science and engineering. Students enrolled in these subjects will be billed approximately an additional \$750 per semester. The published housing fee is for IFSA-Butler provided off-campus housing. Program participants housed in one of the residential colleges other than Emmanuel and Kings will receive a separate bill of approximately \$2,000 for the additional cost of full service housing and a mandatory meal plan.

The housing fee for Emmanuel College and Kings College includes the full cost of housing, including all supplemental costs for housing services and meals.

While IFSA-Butler attempts to accommodate requests for specific housing locations, housing assignments are based on availability of space. IFSA-Butler asks all University of Queensland students to be prepared for the costs of all the university housing options, including Emmanuel College and Kings College.

11. Southern Cross University

Program participants housed in one of the residential colleges will receive a separate bill of approximately \$1,800 per semester for the additional cost of the housing services and meals.

12. University of Sydney

Program participants housed in one of the residential colleges and Sydney University Village will receive a separate bill of \$1,500-\$2,000 per semester for the additional cost of the housing services and meals. Students accepted to study at the Sydney Conservatorium of Music may be charged additional fees. Fees vary greatly, so check with your program advisor.

13. University of Tasmania

Program participants housed in one of the residential colleges will receive a separate bill of approximately \$2,500 per semester for the additional cost of the housing services and meals.

14. University of Technology, Sydney

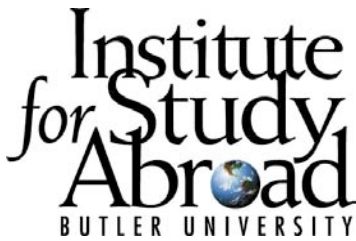
UTS charges supplemental tuition of approximately \$600 for certain journalism and media arts subjects.

15. University of Western Australia

Program participants housed in one of the residential colleges will receive a separate bill of approximately \$1,500 per semester for the additional cost of the housing services and meals. A tuition differential fee of approximately \$1,000 per semester is charged to students who take two or more courses in a laboratory science. There is a similar charge for special programs: architecture, computer science, music or human movement.

16. University of Wollongong

Program participants housed in one of the residential colleges will receive a separate bill of approximately \$1,800 per semester for the additional cost of the housing services and meals.
