### Program Fee Bills

IFSA-Butler will send a single bill for the entire program fee, which includes tuition, services and housing. Students who opt for independent housing will not be charged the housing component of the program fee.

### Tuition

Our tuition fees are based on the arts and social science tuition charged by the host university. However, some universities charge a higher tuition for disciplines such as science, engineering and other specialty areas involving laboratory, studio or field work. We pass the charges for special subjects along to the student as a tuition differential. Tuition differential fees are based on previous years' costs and are subject to change.

### Housing

The housing component of our program fee is based on the average cost of local student self-catering accommodation, usually a shared room in a regular dormitory, apartment or house without any extra features.

When a student is assigned to full-service housing, such as a residential college, there may be a housing supplemental charge for full service facilities. These fees are estimates based on previous years' costs and are subject to change.

Please see program materials or contact your IFSA-Butler program advisor for independent housing options and procedures.

### † Housing Deposit

All students are required to pay a housing deposit of \$300. This payment is in addition to the program fee but is due on the same date. The deposit is held separately from the program fee and should be paid separately. The deposit is refunded to the student after the program, less any damages, fines or outstanding debts in the student's name.

### Supplemental Charges Notes

Charges listed below are approximate costs and may be subject to change. Any fees over these approximate costs will be billed to the responsible party as we receive them from the host university.

#### 1. University of Edinburgh

Additional fees are charged for enrollment in science programs. These fees are approximately \$3,000 per semester and \$6,000 for the year. Several residence halls have mandatory board plans. Students assigned to these halls will be billed approximately \$1,500 per semester or \$2,700 for the year.

#### 2. University of St. Andrews

Students assigned to a residence hall with a mandatory board plan will be charged approximately \$800 to \$1,200 per semester or approximately \$1,800 to \$3,100 for the year.

The above numbers are general estimates of expenses during a program abroad. We recommend taking into account your current spending habits, the cost of living in your host country and the current exchange rate. Your IFSA-Butler program advisor can be helpful as you attempt to work on a personal budget for your experience abroad.

An entry clearance is required for any student who plans to study in the United Kingdom for more than six months or who plans to pursue internships, volunteer work or paid employment. There is no fee for the student visitor visa for the United Kingdom.

† Personal Miscellaneous estimates cover general expenses of college life, including laundry, course supplies, photocopying, toiletries, snacks, personal care, etc.

All costs are in U.S. dollars.
